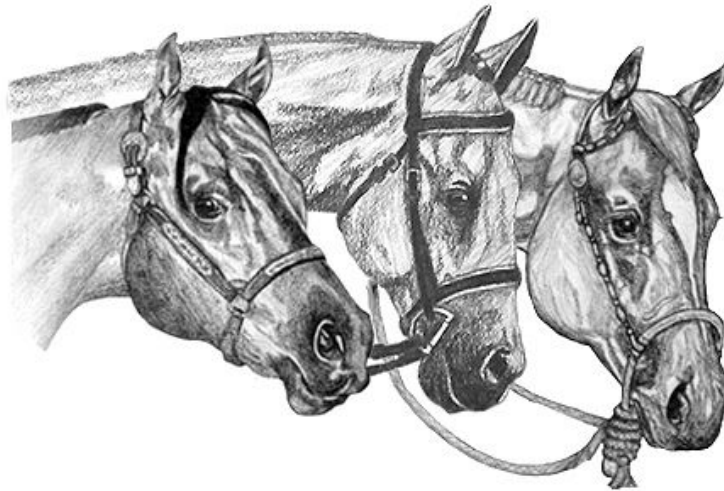

ANNAPOLIS VALLEY EX GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Rule change only by Management Board approval

These General Rules apply to all competitions and exhibitors and have precedence over any other rules adopted by Sub-Committees in any case where there is a conflict between rules.

1. The Management Board has the final and absolute right to interpret all rules and regulations and determine all matters, questions or disputes in regard hereto. The Management Board has the right to amend or add to these rules and regulations as their judgment may determine, from time to time. Entries are accepted subject to this rule. Management may remove exhibitors without refund for disorderly conduct.
2. The Management reserves the right to refuse any exhibitor for lack of space subject to the provision that space will be allocated in the order that entries are received.
3. All entries must be made on prescribed entry forms obtained upon application to the Exhibition Office. Livestock entries close on July 25th each year. Check non-livestock section for relevant entry closing date. Late entries will only be accepted upon motion passed by the Board of Directors (except Flowers & Fruit & Vegetables where late entries will be accepted).
4. Entries will not be accorded precedence as to order of receipt until they are complete in all respects.
5. The Management shall have the sole right and discretion to allocate exhibits and exhibitors to whatever barn, building, stall or space is considered appropriate, notwithstanding any apparent outward designation on the building, grounds or any plan.
6. Articles exhibited other than livestock must be produced, grown or manufactured in the present year.

GROUND & BUILDING

7. The building and grounds will be open on the Sunday prior to the Exhibition for the reception and arrangement of exhibits, unless specified under Class Rules. Exhibitors are reminded that they enter all exhibits at their own risk.
8. The Exhibition grounds will be open to the public during the Exhibition week at times determined by the Management and posted or advertised each year.
9. No pets allowed on the Exhibition grounds during Exhibition week except pets of exhibitors which must be confined to the trailer park.
10. All officials will be designated by proper badges or other designation.
11. **The Annapolis Valley Exhibition restricts all smoking of tobacco, cannabis, e-cigarettes, and waterpipes within 15 meters of all structures on the Exhibition Grounds.**

JUDGING & PRIZES

12. No person shall be permitted to enter the judge's ring while judging is in progress, except the judges, their attendants, the officials and such exhibitors as have been called into the ring by the judge or judges.
13. No changes in classification can be made after judging commences.
14. Any person interfering with the judges while in the discharge of their duties shall be removed from the grounds.
15. All judges shall give reasons for the placings when asked and may give reasons in any case.
16. No person shall be allowed to receive more than one prize in any one section of a non-livestock class. Accordingly, two entries may not be made in any one section or class. Special prizes may be awarded in addition.
17. Any exhibitor found to have employed any disingenuous measure by which the objects of the Exhibition have been defeated, shall not only forfeit the prize which might be awarded to his or her but, shall in future, be barred from competition in the Exhibition.
18. Due to the necessity of proceeding with judging as rapidly as possible, all animals must be ready to enter the ring when called and all other exhibits must be prepared and available when judging begins. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in forfeiture of the right to show in the relevant class.
19. All protests of judge's decisions must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$5.00 and made to the Manager of the Exhibition. Protests or appeals must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Manager within four (4) hours after the occasion for the protest. No protest will be accepted based on the contention that a judge has overlooked an exhibit. If the protest is not sustained, the deposit shall be forfeited.
20. Prize money may be reduced up to 50% at the discretion of the Management Board in the event of reduced income on account of bad weather or other valid reasons. Prize money shortfall is subsidized by the Ex.
21. Committee discretion is final word if livestock is fit to show.
22. All claims for prize money not received must be made to the Manager before November 30th of the current year.
23. Special prizes require a special entry and special exhibit when the terms of the special class vary from the terms of the regular section.

LIVESTOCK ENTRIES

24. Stalls for all livestock entries shall be allotted in order of receipt of entries at the time of entry. Exhibitors may not trade stalls without obtaining the approval of Management and recording the approved trade at the Exhibition Office.
25. All registered animals are subjects to being checked for registration. Registration papers and R.O.P data must be available prior to and up to the time of judging. No animals will be accepted as purebred or registered until registration papers are available from the owner.
26. All cattle must be owned by the exhibitor at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of the Exhibition.
27. Entries in classes comprised of more than one animal may be made up of animals shown individually.
28. Any animal showing signs of infectious disease or parasite infection will be barred from the Exhibition and removed forthwith from the grounds.
29. All livestock competing for special prizes must also be entered in at least one (1) regular exhibition class.
30. Feed and bedding for livestock is the responsibility of the exhibitor. All manure and bedding shall be cleaned up by 8:30 am each day. Stalls will be cleaned and all manure and bedding must be removed from the stall when the animal leaves the grounds or prize money will be forfeited. A minimum charge of \$15.00 per stall will be assessed against exhibitors failing to abide by the rule whether or not any prize money is due.
31. Grooming and care of animals will take place in the stalls or designated area. Cross-tying of livestock in the aisles is not permitted.
32. Due to concerns for movement of traffic and safety of attendants and exhibitors at the Exhibition, the Management Board shall fix times for departure of livestock and other exhibits when classes have been completed each year. For the current year, livestock shall not be removed from the grounds until the following times:
Dairy/Beef – 9:00pm Sat, Lt Horse – after last class, Other Livestock – 10:00pm Sat
33. Livestock trailers are not permitted to be parked inside the grounds. Exhibitors who have not been allocated stalls but wish to show their livestock will park trailers in spots allocated to them by an official.
34. The owner and handler of livestock will be responsible for the behavior and control of his or her animal. Livestock must be well-broke to halter. No dangerous uncontrolled animals will be permitted. The Manager may order any such animal off the grounds without reimbursement for any entry fee or other fees paid.
35. Trailer park admission as Livestock Exhibitor requires participation in 3 classes or more (or go as a non-exhibitor if space permits)
36. Trailers may arrive in the trailer court after 5pm Thursday before the Ex. Trailer court noise curfew is 11:00 pm.
37. Any Trailer pumping Grey Water or Black Water on the ground in the trailer park or exhibition grounds will be removed immediately.
38. **After each Exhibition and all Weekend Events trailers must be removed from grounds or they will be removed at owner's expense.**
39. Returning exhibitors have first refusal on trailer spots, after entry deadline the office will allocate new exhibitor spots (or returning who missed a year) according to size of Trailer. Non Exhibitors are allocated spots after all exhibitors are accommodated. Please note if an exhibitor is not returning you cannot give it to anyone, the office does the allocating. Manager's discretion is final.

40. Trailer Park: All 15 amps may be only 15 amps before the breaker trips. For Example: It will run Fridge, Lights , Air Conditioners. Small Hot Water heater will trip the breaker, Run Air Conditioners at your own risk. Any electrical problems in the Trailer Park, you will need a purchase order from the Office for Electrician to attend.

SAFETY OF EXHIBITS

41. Employees will endeavor to protect and insure good order but owners themselves must assume all risk for exhibits. Should any exhibit be accidentally or willfully damaged or injured, lost or stolen, the Exhibition will provide whatever assistance it can towards the recovery of same, but will not make any payment for the value thereof or reimbursement for the loss.
42. NEW-No Smoking within 2 Meters of buildings, including barns and washrooms.

ANNAPOLIS VALLEY EXHIBITION LIQUOR AND SAFETY POLICY

Board and Staff of the Annapolis Valley Ex wish our visitors to have a great time while at our Exhibition. Please note our policy on the supply of liquor during Ex.

- No person under the age of 19 will be permitted to purchase/consume liquor on our site
- Persons who are lucky enough to look under 19 may be asked for identification at our discretion
- No liquor is to be consumed outside of our pub area, or for residents and guests of the trailer park areas liquor may only be consumed inside trailers. Failure to follow this directive may result in fines from the RCMP.
- Persons who appear impaired will be refused entry to the Exhibition grounds or pub.
- Persons who are violent or causing upset will be removed by security/RCMP and may be barred from the grounds for a time decided by Directors
- Please be safe – don't drink and drive. Impaired drivers will be reported to the RCMP for the safety of other visitors and themselves
- The Ex asks that t-shirts or shirts be worn at all times during your visit.
- Please enjoy yourself and act responsibly

Amateurs must have current credentials (A902)
EC competitors (owners and riders) must have NSEF membership (PTSO)

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-Sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition.. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC- Sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC Constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-Sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. EC RULES AND REGULATIONS

Statement of Principle: Equestrian Canada, the National Equestrian Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its Jurisdiction. Equestrian Canada is committed to:

1. Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
2. Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve and they never be subject to mistreatment.
3. Ensuring that Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors or their respective agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
4. Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
5. Providing current information on Code of Practice for the care and Handling of Equines and other health and welfare initiatives.
6. Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare; increasing education in training and horsemanship practices.
7. Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.
8. Actively promoting the development and adherence of competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane. (A602.3(f))

Jump Canada Board: Is a Committee of Equestrian Canada responsible for the promotion and enhancement of the hunter/jumper discipline. As a Recognized National Equestrian Canada Gold and Bronze Hunter/Jumper Competition, the Annapolis Valley Exhibition will remit a JC Levy of \$20.00 (Gold entries) per horse/pony entered to the Jumper Canada Board. (G106.2) These amounts, which will be collected from each competitor at the time of entry, will be used to support a number of regional and national programs designed to foster the activities of hunter/jumper riders, owners and industry at large. In 2019, these funds will be used as: 60% Hunter, Young Rider and Domestic Programs; 37.5% National/International Teams; 2.5% Administration, including publicity and public relations. 40% of the domestic portion is returned to the province in which it is generated. The Levy is supported by EC and failure to participate may lead to suspension of Sport Licence. In Nova Scotia these funds are dispersed by the NS Hunter Jumper Association. A V Ex will remit NSHJA Levy of \$8.00 (Bronze entries) per horse/pony entered to NSHJA. For information, please visit: www.nshj.ca

"Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book" A602.2

1. **Memberships: 2019**

1. All Canadian owners and riders must have a valid EC Gold or Bronze Sport Licence (A205)-(A207) OR purchase a Single Event Upgrade (A211) or Licence Transfer (A212) for a Silver or Bronze Sport License to Gold Licence; OR purchase a Temporary Sport Licence (A208 – not eligible for points)
2. Competitors also require provincial territorial sport organization (PTSO) (ie NSEF) membership.
3. All athletes and owners must be holders of a current membership in their home country's national federation, and foreign entries must sign an affidavit
4. All athletes competing in Amateur classes must possess a valid EC Amateur Card and must present it to the Competition Secretary upon request (A902)
5. Please be aware that NSHJA membership is required to participate and/or benefit in the NSHJA Programs.
6. Please be aware, some classes only require Bronze EC memberships, and some require Gold. If you choose to compete with a Bronze membership in Gold classes, you must upgrade your membership or purchase a single event upgrade.

2. **EC Horse Recordings/FEI Passports; Licences 2019:**

- A. All Canadian entries are required to have an EC Horse Recording with a valid EC horse license to compete (A402), or if owned by a temporary sport license holder a Temporary Horse Registration form must be purchased at each competition entered. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit. (A404)
- B. Exception: Horses competing in only the hack division.
- C. Horse licences are required for all horses competing in Gold classes.
- D. Horse licences are not required for horses competing in Bronze classes, however if a competitor wishes to compete in Gold classes they must purchase a temporary horse licence or a permanent one.

3. **Mandatory** Liability Insurance - NSEF (PTSO) Membership Card 2019

4. **Protective Headgear:** See A905 and G102.
At all times persons mounted at an EC-sanctioned event must wear approved protective head gear ,certified by ASTM, or SEI,BSI/BS EN; or AS/NZS and Properly fitted & securely fastened by a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet.
5. **Dress Code:** See G109
6. **Measurement of Ponies** - Ponies will be measured in Barn #8, Thursday@ 9:00 am. If measurement is required, inform Exhibition Office when picking up back number.
7. **Health of Animals** - It is advised that all entries should have been immunized against equine influenza and rhino within one year. It is suggested that this should have been done at least one month before the show in case of reaction. Any animal which appears in the opinion of the Exhibition Veterinarian, to be ill, will be asked to leave the grounds. It is also advised that all entries be Coggins tested within the previous 6 months.
8. **EC Equine Medication Control - Gold — \$7.50; Bronze - \$3.50 per horse/pony.** Any horse entered in any class at an EC competition may be selected for equine medication control testing, while at the Event location drug testing may be carried out at this show. (A602.5)
9. **Stallions** - Stallions shall be barred from any class, the conditions of which specify that a junior is to ride or drive except as provided for in division rules. Decisions as to the manageability of stallions is at the discretion of the judge/ steward.
10. **Cross Entries** - Cross entries between sections allowed where eligible.
11. **Stabling** - Do not rearrange stalls or stabling. Due to limited stalls, no light horse entry will be accepted after suitable stalls are filled. The Committee reserves the right to limit the number of entries. Exhibitors must show in 3 or more classes for stabling.
12. **Cancellation of Classes** - If less than 3 entries in a class, the Committee reserves the right to cancel the class. Every effort will be made to notify exhibitors (phone) if classes are cancelled. Hunter divisions may be combined if necessary.
13. **Refunds** - There will be no refund without a Vet or Doctor certificate after closing date. Refunds will be made within 2 weeks following show.
14. **Jump Orders** - Jump order will be posted ½ hour before Hunter Classes;1 hour before Jumper Classes. Register cancellations with the Ring Clerk at the Main Ring PA Booth prior to class.
15. **Hors Concours** - Not allowed in Hunter (G401); may be allowed in Jumper (G501). Allowed only if ring time permits and entry fees will apply.
16. **EC Prize Money** - will be mailed.
17. **Provincial Awards** - All those working towards Provincial Championship Points, please enter the animal in the name of the owner who is the official Equine Canada member and include owner's EC number on entry form. Rider must have EC membership number as well.
18. **Exhibitors** - Exhibitors must report to the Exhibition Office before stabling and report to the Ring Clerk at the Main Ring PA Booth before showing.
19. **Class Times** - Owing to the length of the horse show program, no delays will be tolerated. All entries must enter the ring immediately when a class is called. When the gate is closed, no further entries will be admitted.
20. **Arrival & Exit** - EC Light Horse stalls will not be available until Wednesday mid-afternoon. Hunters must exit stalls immediately following last class due to arrival of Jumpers (except for Hunters showing in Jumper classes). When exhibitor's last class is over, horses will exit. **ARRIVE AT WEST GATE + EXIT AT EAST GATE. PLEASE NOTE NEW LOADING/ UNLOADING AREA**
21. **Horse Trailers** - There will be no parking of livestock trailers on the Exhibition Grounds. Parking for trailers in parking lot. No Charge: Designated.
22. **Back Numbers** - Plasticized back numbers (\$10.00 refundable) must be worn in Show Ring and Practice Ring. After last class, return numbers to Ring Clerk in PA Booth for refund. Back number must be visible to judge at all times.
23. **Exhibitor Trailer Court** - on the Exhibition grounds. Fee includes water and power. One car or ½ ton may be parked in trailer court
24. **Services** - Emergency medical services available onsite. Middleton Veterinary Services: (902) 825- 3459;
Bridgetown Animal Hospital: (902) 665- 4333
25. **Bedding** - Exhibitors to bring own bedding.
26. **Cross Tying** - No cross tying of horses in any barn.
27. **Ribbons** - Award Ribbons must be received in ring.
28. **Stalls** - Stalls must be cleaned after last class

Concussion Awareness

Equestrian Canada Concussion Protocols- Equestrian Canada (EC) is one of the first national governing bodies for sport in Canada to implement official, sport-specific guidelines on return-to-play protocols for athlete concussions.

EC's Accidents & Return-to-Play Rule

EC's concussion-related Accidents & Return-to-Play Rule came into effect Jan. 1, 2017 for all EC sanctioned competitions in Canada. The full rule can be found in the EC Rules, Section A, General Regulations, Article 101 .

ENTRY FEES
