♦ Hunter Divisions—Ribbons awarded to 6th place. Divisions will include two over fence, and an under saddle class. Note: Cross Rail Division U/S class - entries will not be asked to canter.

◆ Schooling rounds are available. Rider must have ticket from show office to give to in-gate, limited number of rounds. \$5 ticket—four minutes per ticket. Rider's judged round will immediately follow their warm up round.

♦ Jumper Divisions—Ribbons awarded to 6th place. The Welcome class in each division is a Red Ribbon Class—no jump off.

- ♦ ENTRIES RECEIVED ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW ADD \$20 late entry fee.
- ◆ Cancellation of competitions: In the event there are not sufficient entries in hand by the Wednesday preceding each competition, the event may be cancelled.

◆ STABLING: There are stalls available for a fee of \$20 a night. Exhibitors must provide their own bedding. Free wifi is available. Camping sites are available for a cost of \$15 per night.

Guidelines 2019

NSEF or PTSO membership is required to participate as a competitor. Membership to the Nova Scotia Hunter Jumper Association is encouraged, support your Hunter Jumper Association.

Mission:

- To provide a venue for riders and/or horses to gain experience and develop their abilities to excel in equestrian sport
- To create a safe and enjoyable experience for horses/riders/spectators
- To provide an opportunity for horses and riders to learn to train and compete

Principles:

This competition will conduct its competition within the guidelines outlined below and within the realm of conventional hunter and jumper rules as those which govern licensed competitions in Canada.

Coaches and competitors, by entering the competition, agree to use prudent judgment and exhibit good sportsmanship. Any act of discourtesy or disobedience may result in being asked to leave the venue. The competition management retains the right of final decision without being liable for compensation or damage.

Our designated Risk Management Official is responsible along with the competition management to ensure that the guidelines are followed.

As a competition organizer, we endeavor to engage the services of competent knowledgeable individuals.

As a competition organizer, an EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN will be in place.

We encourage competitors to be aware of bio-security measures they can practice for the health of their horse.

Our competition retains liability coverage and demands the same from each competitor on the show grounds. All entries must have the signature of the owner or authorized agent and a signature for the person responsible for the horse. Riders will not be allowed to compete without a signature from the person responsible. Junior riders (under the age of 19) must have permission to participate in the show as indicated by the signature of a parent or guardian.

Heart of Scotia Hunter Jumper Show and Annapolis Valley Exhibition, its Management, Organizing Committee, Officials, Volunteers or Show Staff are in no way responsible for accident, injury or damage to any rider, exhibitor, spectator, groom, attendant, trainer or other employee; or animals, nor theft, loss or damage to animals, vehicles or equipment.

Although divisions in both hunter and jumper over 0.9M (3') may be a small entry, we will offer them as schedule permits to encourage and provide a platform for riders to move up.

Competitors are responsible for knowing the Rules of the Scotia Series Competitions and also for identifying which classes at our competitions meet the criteria for Scotia Series Awards.
