ANNAPOLIS VALLEY EX GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Rule change only by Management Board approval

These General Rules apply to all competitions and exhibitors and have precedence over any other rules adopted by Sub-Committees in any case where there is a conflict between rules.

1. The Management Board has the final and absolute right to interpret all rules and regulations and determine all matters, questions or disputes in regard hereto. The Management Board has the right to amend or add to these rules and regulations as their judgment may determine, from time to time. Entries are accepted subject to this rule. Management may remove exhibitors without refund for disorderly conduct.
2. The Management reserves the right to refuse any exhibitor for lack of space subject to the provision that space will be allocated in the order that entries are received.
3. All entries must be made on prescribed entry forms obtained upon application to the Exhibition Office. Livestock entries close on July 25th each year. Check non- livestock section for relevant entry closing date. Late entries will only be accepted upon motion passed by the Board of Directors (except Flowers & Fruit & Vegetables where late entries will be accepted).
4. Entries will not be accorded precedence as to order of receipt until they are complete in all respects.
5. The Management shall have the sole right and discretion to allocate exhibits and exhibitors to whatever barn, building, stall or space is considered appropriate, notwithstanding any apparent outward designation on the building, grounds or any plan.
6. Articles exhibited other than livestock must be produced, grown or manufactured in the present year.

GROUND & BUILDINGS

1. The building and grounds will be open on the Sunday prior to the Exhibition for the reception and arrangement of exhibits, unless specified under Class Rules. Exhibitors are reminded that they enter all exhibits at their own risk.
2. The Exhibition grounds will be open to the public during the Exhibition week at times determined by the Management and posted or advertised each year.
3. No pets allowed on the Exhibition grounds during Exhibition week except pets of exhibitors which must be confined to the trailer park.
4. All officials will be designated by proper badges or other designation.
5. No Smoking within 2 Meters of buildings, including barns and washrooms.

JUDGING & PRIZES

1. No person shall be permitted to enter the judge's ring while judging is in progress, except the judges, their attendants, the officials and such exhibitors as have been called into the ring by the judge or judges.
2. No changes in classification can be made after judging commences.
3. Any person interfering with the judges while in the discharge of their duties shall be removed from the grounds.
4. All judges shall give reasons for the placings when asked and may give reasons in any case.
5. No person shall be allowed to receive more than one prize in any one section of a non-livestock class. Accordingly, two entries may not be made in any one section or class. Special prizes may be awarded in addition.
6. Any exhibitor found to have employed any disingenuous measure by which the objects of the Exhibition have been defeated, shall not only forfeit the prize which might be awarded to his or her but, shall in future, be barred from competition in the Exhibition.
7. Due to the necessity of proceeding with judging as rapidly as possible, all animals must be ready to enter the ring when called and all other exhibits must be prepared and available when judging begins. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in forfeit of the right to show in the relevant class.
8. All protests of judge's decisions must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$5.00 and made to the Manager of the Exhibition. Protests or appeals must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Manager within four (4) hours after the occasion for the protest. No protest will be accepted based on the contention that a judge has overlooked an exhibit. If the protest is not sustained, the deposit shall be forfeited.
9. Prize money may be reduced up to 50% at the discretion of the Management Board in the event of reduced income on account of bad weather or other valid reasons. Prize money shortfall is subsidized by the Ex.
10. Committee discretion is final word if livestock is fit to show.
11. All claims for prize money not received must be made to the Manager before November 30th of the current year.
12. Special prizes require a special entry and special exhibit when the terms of the special class vary from the terms of the regular section.
13. Prize book entries accepted one week before Exhibition.
14. All non-livestock prize money is available; the Monday after the Ex in the Office.

ANNAPOLIS VALLEY EXHIBITION LIQUOR AND SAFETY POLICY

Board and Staff of the Annapolis Valley Ex wish our visitors to have a great time while at our Exhibition. Please note our policy on the supply of liquor during Ex.

- No person under the age of 19 will be permitted to purchase/consume liquor on our site
- Persons who are lucky enough to look under 19 may be asked for identification at our discretion
- No liquor is to be consumed outside of our pub area, or for residents and guests of the trailer park areas liquor may only be consumed inside trailers. Failure to follow this directive may result in fines from the RCMP.
- Persons who appear impaired will be refused entry to the Exhibition grounds or pub.
- Persons who are violent or causing upset will be removed by security/RCMP and may be barred from the grounds for a time decided by Directors
- Please be safe – don't drink and drive. Impaired drivers will be reported to the RCMP for the safety of other visitors and themselves
- The Ex asks that t-shirts or shirts be worn at all times during your visit.
- Please enjoy yourself and act responsibly

RULES & REGULATIONS

Entry forms due to Exhibition Office July 22nd.

Feed for Poultry & Pet Stock kindly donated by **Co-op Atlantic**

All exhibits will be fed and watered by the Committee PLEASE NOTE MAX# OF BIRDS UNDER EACH SECTION.

All exhibits must be cooped by 9:00am Monday, (August 16th) of the Exhibition. Judging will begin 9:00am Monday.

Building will be open 2:00pm-6:30pm Sunday before the Exhibition.

1. The Committee has authority to reject any exhibits showing signs of disease or those of inferior quality.
2. No animal or article deemed unworthy shall be awarded a premium. No premium shall be withheld merely because there is no competition, except where otherwise specified. Judges are instructed to award premiums according to merit of the animal or article.
3. Birds to be shown as Cock and Hen. Exhibitors will please note that in making entries, Class Number must be shown along with Section Number, with letter C for Cock and letter H for Hen. Same system applies to Rabbits using letter M for Male and letter F for female.
4. This Committee reserves the right to reject entries when all the coops are taken.
5. Owing to lack of cooping facilities, it is regretted that ducks and geese cannot be accepted.
6. Should there be only one entry in any Section, the award given will depend on the quality of the exhibit.
7. Where, in any section, there are five or more exhibits, the Judge may, at his/ her discretion, award a 4th prize.

N.S. POULTRY SHOW HEALTH MONITORING POLICY

1. All birds must be in good health & condition to be entered in the Exhibition.
2. Decisions to refuse admittance of an Entry to the show because of poor health can be appealed to the Dept of Agriculture Vet. His decision is final.
3. All mortality and birds showing poor health during the Show will be reported by the Show Manager to the Department of Agriculture Supervisor. The Show Supervisor will inspect these birds and if he feels it is warranted, will remove them from the Show.
4. Show Management and Exhibitors are responsible for accounting for all birds to Show Supervisor.
5. No birds or rabbits can be removed from Show prior to the end of the Show without written permission of Show Supervisor.
