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ANNAPOLIS VALLEY EX GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Rule change only by The Board approval

These General Rules apply to all competitions and exhibitors and have precedence over any other rules adopted by Sub-Committees in any case where there is a conflict between rules.

1. The Board of Directors has the final and absolute right to interpret all rules and regulations and determine all matters, questions or disputes. The Board has the right to amend or add to these rules and regulations as their judgment may determine, from time to time. Entries are accepted subject to this rule, by signing the entry form, participants agree to abide by the rules defined.
2. Management may remove exhibitors without refund for disorderly conduct.
3. The Management reserves the right to refuse any exhibitor for lack of space subject to the provision that space will be allocated first come first serve.
4. All entries must be submitted on AVEx entry forms. Please refer to specific prize book for entry deadlines and rules. Late entries will only be accepted if space allows. A late fee will be charged see entry form for amount.
5. Entries will not be accorded precedence as to order of receipt until they are complete in all respects.
6. The Management shall have the sole right and discretion to allocate exhibits and exhibitors to whatever barn, building, stall, or space is considered appropriate, notwithstanding any apparent outward designation on the building, grounds or any plan.
7. Articles exhibited other than livestock must be produced, grown or manufactured in the present year.

GROUND & BUILDINGS

1. The building and grounds will be open on Sunday after 1pm prior to the Exhibition for the reception and arrangement of exhibits, unless specified under Class Rules. Exhibitors are reminded that they enter all exhibits at their own risk.
2. The Exhibition grounds will be open to the public during the Exhibition week at times determined by the Management and posted or advertised each year.
3. No pets allowed on the Exhibition property during Exhibition week except pets of exhibitors which must be confined to the trailer park.
4. All officials will be designated by proper badges or other designation.
5. There is no exhibitor parking on the grounds. Supplies may be dropped off before 8:30 in the morning and vehicles are to be immediately moved to the designated exhibitor parking in the main parking lot. *****First offense – a ticket on windshield, second offense – forfeit prize monies, third offense vehicle(s) will be towed at the owner’s expense.*****
6. The Annapolis Valley Exhibition restricts all smoking of tobacco, cannabis, and vapes within 15 meters of all structures on the Exhibition Grounds. No smoking of any substance in the bleachers.

JUDGING & PRIZES

1. No person shall be permitted to enter the judge’s ring while judging is in progress, except the judges, their attendants, the officials, and such exhibitors as have been called into the ring by the judge or judges.
2. No changes in classification can be made after judging commences.
3. Any person interfering with the judges while in the discharge of their duties shall be removed from the grounds.
4. All judges shall give reasons for the placings when asked and may give reasons in any case.

5. No person shall be allowed to receive more than one prize in any one section of a non-livestock class. Accordingly, two entries may not be made in any one section or class. Special prizes may be awarded in addition.
6. Any exhibitor found to have employed any dishonest measures shall not only forfeit the prize which might be awarded to him or her but, shall in future, be barred from competition in the Exhibition.
7. Due to the necessity of proceeding with judging as rapidly as possible, all animals must be ready to enter the ring when called and all other exhibits must be prepared and available when judging begins. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in forfeiting of the right to show in the relevant class.
8. All protests of the judge's decisions must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$25.00 and made to the Manager of the Exhibition. Protests or appeals must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Manager within four (4) hours after the occasion for the protest. No protest will be accepted based on the contention that a judge has overlooked an exhibit. If the protest is not sustained, the deposit shall be forfeited.
9. Prize money may be reduced up to 50% at the discretion of the Board in the event of reduced income due to bad weather, lack of entries, or other valid reasons.
10. Committee discretion has the final word on whether livestock is fit to show.
11. All claims for prize money not received must be made to the Manager before September 30th of the current year.
12. Special prizes require a special entry and special exhibit when the terms of the special class vary from the terms of the regular section.

SAFETY OF EXHIBITS

1. Employees will endeavor to protect and ensure good order but owners themselves must assume all risk for exhibits. Should any exhibit be accidentally or willfully damaged or injured, lost or stolen, the Exhibition will provide whatever assistance it can towards the recovery of the same, but will not make any payment for the value thereof or reimbursement for the loss.
2. **NEW** - No Smoking within 15 Meters of buildings, including barns and washrooms.

ANNAPOLIS VALLEY EXHIBITION LIQUOR AND SAFETY POLICY

The Board and Staff of the Annapolis Valley Ex wish our visitors have a great time while at our Exhibition. Please note our policy on the supply of liquor during Ex.

No person under the age of 19 will be permitted to purchase/consume liquor on our site.

Identification to be presented when requested.

No liquor is to be consumed outside of our pub area.

For residents and guests of the trailer park areas, liquor may only be consumed inside trailers. Failure to follow this directive may result in fines from the RCMP.

Persons who appear impaired will be refused entry to the Exhibition grounds or pub and will be removed by security/RCMP.

Persons who are violent or causing upset will be removed by security/RCMP and may be barred from the grounds for a period decided by The Board of Directors.

Please be safe – don't drink and drive. Impaired drivers will be reported to the RCMP for T-shirts or shirts be worn at all times during your visit.

- Exhibits must be in place 6:30pm-10:00pm Sunday, August 13th. Late entries after 10:00pm will not be accepted.
- The building will be open 9:30am – 10:30am Sunday after Ex for exhibit removal. Exhibits must be removed before Monday August 21. Entries left after this time will be destroyed unless other arrangements are made with a committee member.
- Due to the early date of the Exhibition, the display of apples will be less than usual so varieties of early maturity will help to replace, to some extent, the later varieties. Plates of exhibits must be of good marketable sizes.
- **Ex Office will be open Mon-Fri 9-4 the week following the Exhibition for prize pick up. Any prizes not picked up by Aug 25th will be considered donations to Annapolis Valley Exhibition.**

RULES & REGULATIONS

- All Entry forms in Creative Crafts categories must be received by August 1st, 2023.
- Creative Crafts entries must be in the office no later than 4:30pm, Thursday August 10th, 2023. Closed judging of the entries will take place Friday August 11th, 2023.
- Be advised, late entries will not be accepted.

Entry Guidelines, please read carefully

1. All articles must be the work of the exhibitor only (unless otherwise specified) and must have been completed since the last exhibition.
2. All articles must be clean and free of stains or animal hair.
3. Only one entry per section by an individual.
4. The Judge(s) are not required to award prize money in any section which the Judge(s) considers the work to be below standard.
5. Articles entered for competition may be sold by the committee members on behalf of the exhibitor. If you wish your entry to be sold, please provide a clear "FOR SALE" sign and state the price. "For Sale Forms" are available at the Exhibition Office and must be entered with your article.
6. The Committee levies a 10% commission for selling the article, please state somewhere on your article if the Committee should add 10% or deduct it from the sale price of your article.
7. For articles with Christmas theming, please consider sections 51-59.
8. Sections are open to all age ranges unless otherwise stated

Entry Pick up After the Exhibition

1. Items may be picked up beginning Monday August 21st, 2023, from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm at the Creative Crafts Building - the pink copy of your entry form must be presented at the time of pick up.
2. If you are unable to pick up your item on August 21st the Exhibition Office will be open weekdays, 9:00 am to 5:00 pm for one week after the closure of the Exhibition.
3. **Ex Office will be open Mon-Fri 9-4 the week following the Exhibition for prize pick up. Any prizes not picked up by Aug 25th will be considered donations to Annapolis Valley Exhibition.**

7. Quilt - Miniature - must have all the elements of a full-size quilt but no larger than 60" around the outside edge.
8. Quilt-made by more than one person (example: owner pieced and quilted by a group; blocks made by others but completed by owner; top made by another person but quilted by owner)-minimum size 60"x80" Label MUST be sewn on with specifics of who is attributed to which part of the quilt.
9. NEW! Quilt block challenge- make one 12.5" unfinished block of bear paw pattern- top only.
